What you can recycle - and where ...

There was lots of interest at the recent B-earth Day event, with many people finding out what they can recycle – and where?

Here is the useful information provided:

Household collection service:

Paper: newspapers, magazines, junk mail, computer paper, envelopes, catalogues and directories and paper bags

Plastic bottles: food and drink bottles, detergent bottles, toiletries (eg shampoo, shower gel, liquid soap), bottle tops

Tins and cans: food tins including pet food tins, drinks cans, sweet and biscuit tins

Aerosols: food eg. cream and oil, deodorant, hairspray

Garden waste: a separate 'opt in', paid-for collection service (although this waste can be taken to the Household Waste & Recycling Centre in Petersfield free of charge)

St Marys Church, Buriton:

Toothbrushes and toothpaste tubes (including electric toothbrush heads) Medication/tablet blister packs (empty) Used stamps Milk bottle tops (plastic)

Tesco, Petersfield:

Green collection container by roundabout:

Juice cartons (including caps and straws)

Pringles tubes (no lids)
